Welcoming a new Head of School


During the summer term, the academy and the trust welcomed Mark Clifford as the new Head of School for Denewood.

Since April 2023, Raleigh Education Trust's Alternative Provision Specialist Taskforce (APST) has supported over 149 children and families through our tier 3 approach.

The team's dedicated work has seen a reduction in referrals to external services by approx. 30%.





Since January, the Attendance Taskforce has supported over 90 pupils and families from mainstream educational settings across the city. The primary goal for the team is to break down attendance-related barriers to enable children to access education daily.

77% of pupils receiving support have made improvements in their school attendance. Well done team!



Attendance and Welfare Team

The Trust Attendance and Welfare Team has worked tirelessly over the academic year, frequently using creative methods to overcome barriers.

In collaboration with the schools, the team launched targeted incentive schemes during the summer term to encourage, recognise, and celebrate the efforts of children and their families. These incentives included funded family outings and voucher programmes.

Thanks to the team's relationship-building skills and their persistent attitude, there have been numerous successes in improving pupil attendance over the academic year.
